

Coronavirus Vaccines approved for use in Nauru

As of 16 December 2021, for Regulation 6A (1), the recognised vaccines are;

- AstraZeneca (AZD1222/Vaxzevria)

2 doses at least 4 weeks apart

Approved for use in Nauru & WHO Emergency listing

- AstraZeneca (Covishield)

2 doses at least 4 weeks apart

Approved for use in Nauru & WHO Emergency listing

- Pfizer/BioNTech (Cominarty/Tozinameran)

2 doses at least 3 weeks apart

Approved for use in Nauru & WHO Emergency listing

- Moderna (Spikevax)

2 doses at least 4 weeks apart

Approved by WHO Emergency listing

- Jansen (Johnson & Johnson)

1 dose Approved by WHO Emergency listing

- Sinopharm (Beijing/BBIBP)

2 doses, recommended to be 3-4 weeks apart

Approved by WHO Emergency listing

- Sinovac (Coronavac)

2 doses, recommended to be 2-4 weeks apart

Approved by WHO Emergency listing

- Covaxin (Bharat Biotech)

2 doses at least 4 weeks apart



Approved by WHO Emergency listing

At this time, there are no other vaccines that have been approved for use by a competent National regulatory Authority that are not already approved for use in Nauru or by WHO, as listed above.

The above vaccines and recommended intervals for doses are as per WHO recommendations.
